## **SEATGEEK STADIUM - BRIDGEVIEW, ILLINOIS**

SeatGeek Stadium is the heart of soccer for much of the Midwest and a must-see destination for world-class concerts and other sporting events. Each year, more than a half million people go by the stadium's trademark brick arch, many achieving or reliving what has become a rite of passage for sports and music fans alike.

Since opening its doors in 2006, SeatGeek Stadium has treated fans to sporting events of all calibers from around the world, and is the proud home of the Chicago Red Stars (NWSL), and the Chicago Bliss (Legends Football League). SeatGeek Stadium's expansive parking lots are also the site of many festivals, carnivals, multi-stage concerts, and other special events.

The facility is owned and managed by the Village of Bridgeview. It can seat 20,000 for sporting events and 28,000 for concerts, featuring 34 executive suites plus 6 stage suites (available for sporting events).

SeatGeek Stadium is conveniently located in Bridgeview near I-294 and I-55, an easy drive from every corner of the Chicago area. Only 15 miles from Chicago's Loop, SeatGeek Stadium offers ample parking.

## **PARKING**

Parking at SeatGeek Stadium is \$20 and can be purchased online when you purchase match tickets. Parking on matchday is cash only and opens (2) two hours prior to kickoff. S2 is the main parking lot gate entrance.

## **BOX OFFICE**

The box office opens (3) three hours prior to kickoff. The Main Box Office is located on the east side of the SeatGeek Stadium at Gate D. Press/ media check-in is located at Gate E.

## **TAILGATING**

Tailgating opens (3) three hours prior to kickoff and is permitted in all parking lots.

All media members must apply for a season or single-game credential with the Red Stars' Communications Department in order to cover Red Stars matches.

Once media members receive approval, they will receive an email with instructions and protocols for the match they selected to cover.

On matchday, media members must park in the east lot at SeatGeek Stadium and enter/exit through Gate E. Once at Gate E, a Red Stars communications staff member will check in members of the media and provide a credential and/or a bib for photographers. Media check-in begins 90 minutes prior to the match's kick off time.

Upon entering the stadium, media members are required to make their way straight to Ida B. Wells Press Row on the west side of the stadium.

Buffet-style meals will be set up in the press box 90 minutes prior to kick off.

Media will not have access to the field unless it was requested and approved upon submission of their credential application. Additionally, there will be no access to the tunnel or back of house areas of the stadium.

10 to 15 minutes after the final whistle, Red Stars communications associates will host a post-match media availability with 1-2 players and the head coach in the stadium club on the second floor on the west side of the stadium. Media members can access the stadium club by following the concourse around the stadium to the stairs on the west side of the stadium. An option to attend the media availability virtually will be made available to anyone who would like to attend virtually.





# Photographer Protocols

Photographers are permitted to station themselves on the west side of the field (across from the benches and to the left of the goals) and behind the field boards. While inside the stadium, photographers must wear the assigned orange bib and credential that they pick up upon entering the stadium from the media check-in station at Gate E. At halftime, photographers are welcome to work from Ida B. Wells Press Row, or stay fieldside. After the final whistle, photographers must return their bibs to a CRS staff member or volunteer.

Media credentialed photographers will have no access to the east side (bench side) of the field and are not allowed to step on the field at any point. Only Red Stars and Imagn photographers are allowed to step onto the field and capture images from the east side of the stadium. Failure to comply to this protocol will result in immediate re-evaluation and possible revoking of your credential.
